

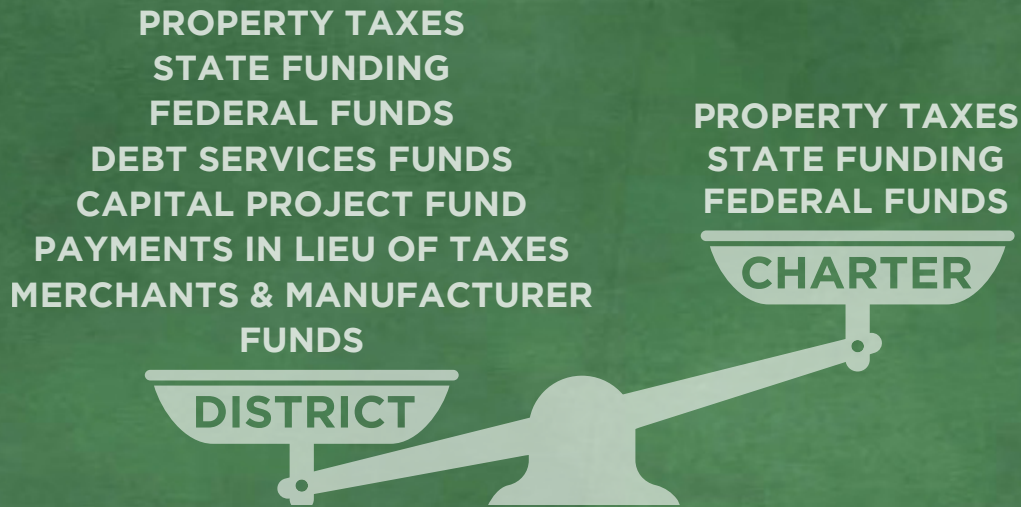
PUBLIC SCHOOL INEQUITY IN KANSAS CITY AND ST. LOUIS

Why do some public school children receive less?



Funding inequities result in charter school students receiving, on average, at least \$2K less per student in weighted average daily attendance than their public school peers.

PUBLIC SCHOOL FUNDING IS NOT EQUITABLE



INEQUITY #1

Historical Data vs Current Year Data

Charter school funds are based on information from as long ago as 2005.

Meanwhile local districts are compensated using current year revenues.

INEQUITY #2

Exclusion of Revenue Resources

Charter school students are excluded from receiving some local funds that are available to district children.

- Debt service fund revenues
- Capital project fund revenues
- Merchants & manufacturers tax revenues
- Payments in lieu of taxes (Kansas City)
